### New collections

**Baker B**, (1 box). This small collection consists of a scrapbook and other information on Baker compiled by C. E. Baker between about 1914 and 1937. It was extracted from the Document Collection in March, 2000.

**Dyson**, (6 boxes). This collection was the work of Roger Dyson of Solihull. On his decease in 1999, his collection was bequeathed to the Society in March, 2000 by Peter Rodwell. The collection is in effect a one-name study for the surname Dyson. The name seems to have been common on the CAM/ESS/SFK borders and in WRY.

**Eyre B**, (2 boxes). This collection was deposited by Vincent E. F. Eyre, CBE of Corfe Mullin, DOR in October, 1998. It comprises research into the Eyre family of DBY, although there is also material about the family in WIL and USA. There is some overlap with the other Eyre collection.

**Gunner**, (1 box). This small collection was given to the Society as the result of the bequest of David Gunner of London (1955-2000). The collection arrived at the Society in May, 2000 and much of it consists of manuscript notes which can be difficult to read. Names included are: Colwell, 19th century, HAM; Gunner, 19th century, HAM, LND; Saunders, 19th century, KEN; Snelgrove, 18th - 19th centuries, HAM, LND, WIL; Spicer, 19th century, GSY.

**Hartley**, (1 box). This small collection was left to the Society by Dr. Mary Hartley of Cambridge in July, 1998. It largely comprises of work on families in Wales (particularly Merioneth) and CAM, LAN, and SSX in England. In particular, there is detailed research for Ai(n)scough and variants of Mawdesley, LAN and the

descendants of Owen 'Y Barwn' of MER. **Hill B**, (1 box). This large notebook was deposited at the Society by Mrs Joan M. Eyles in July, 1956 and was found in Store A. It comprises notes made by Arthur Hill, MA (1866-1936) of Lyndhurst, HAM between about 1904 and 1924. Families mentioned in these notes are: Biggs, STS, WOR and Symons, CON.

**Jowers**, (1 box). A small collection of material presented to the Society by Mr J. E. Jowers of Harrow, MDX in March, 2000 comprising photocopies of wills and administrations between 1858 and 1992. They relate to his book 'Jowers Wills and Administrations at the Probate Registries for England and Wales, 1858-1992', a copy of which can be found in the Family History Collection together with a list of Jower births, marriages and deaths and memoirs of the donor.

**Labone**, (1 box). This photocopied history in two parts of the Labone family of LAN, SCT, NZ and AUA was presented to the Society by its author, Reg Labone, in April, 1999. The family appears to have come to England in about 1850 possibly from France. Also included is material relating to Exton of LAN.

**Leaf**, (1 box, 10 files). This collection was deposited by Penelope Leaf, the widow of William Leaf (1938-2000) in May, 2000. William Leaf was an heraldic artist and teacher and the collection consists of research he undertook largely on his own and related families. A few large pedigrees have been extracted and are available separately. Amongst other names included are: Bailey, Beckmann, Beresford, Carter, Eure, Fitzherbert, Leaf, Tyrell.

**Lovell**, (16 boxes). This collection comprises of a Lovell one-name study and family papers undertaken by George Lovell Harrison (1855-c1936, the son of William Henry Harrison (1825-99) and Frances Sarah Lovell (1830-1903). The date of the arrival of these papers at the Society is unknown but may have been after the death of the compiler. The first eight boxes have been on the shelves of the Upper Library for many years. The remainder were found in Store A. The collection consists largely of notebooks together with some family papers. The surnames covered are Harrison and Lovell. Because of the fragile nature of the material, it is kept in Store A. Please apply to staff.

**Miles**, (1 box). A small collection presented to the Society by Alan A. Miles of Bexley, KEN in March, 2000. It largely consists of photocopies and notes relating to John Miles, a 19th century seaman and his descendants in LND, KEN, SRY.

**Mytton**, (1 box). An index to births, marriages and deaths for Mytton/Mitton and variants for the period between the 16th and 20th centuries. It was donated to the Society by Mr M. W. Mitty of Hullbridge, ESS in May, 2000.

**Rendel**, (1 box). This small collection consists of two files relating to Beardmore and Dobson. The files are largely narrative drafts prepared for family histories. The collection was donated by Miss Rosemary Rendel of London in May, 2000.

**Street**, (1 box). Two volumes of a computer printout of marriages (and some births, deaths and entries in the IGI) taken from the GRO indexes for the name Street. It was compiled by Mr A. C. E. Street from New Malden, SRY.

**Thorpe**, (1 box, 7 files). This small collection consists of notes, correspondence and pedigrees relating to the

ancestors of John Richard Thorpe (1918-98). He was born in Lincoln and moved to South Africa as child where he died. The papers were deposited by Warwick E. Burton of Epping, ESS, who undertook much of the research. The Thorpe family appears to have come mainly from DUR, LND, MDX and NFK.

**Tyndale**, (1 box). This collection was given to the Society by Mr T. W. D. Atkinson in February, 1948. It consists of family papers, deeds and correspondence relating to the ancestry of George Booth Tyndale of Bathford, SOM, who lived between about 1772 and 1830. The earliest items date from the late 17th century and the latest from the mid-19th century.

## *The 'new' will depository at Somerset House*

In 1874 the collection of wills formerly kept at Doctors Commons were transferred to Somerset House where they were until very recently. However, in describing the arrangements for keeping them Edward Walford, in *Old and New London*, adds the following: 'The fact that in the new office at Somerset House there is a depository for the executed wills of living persons (as, indeed, there was in Doctors' Commons) must be set down in the category of 'things not generally known'. Known, however, or not, it is true; for any man or woman in the country not

incapacitated from making a will may forthwith sign, seal and deliver here, on payment of a fee of 12s 6d, his or her last will and testament, to be kept safely and securely until his or her death makes it operative'. Obviously any wills which were eventually proved will be found in the standard records which we all use but does anyone know where there is a collection of unproved wills or whether there are any ledgers relating to the deposit or removal of such wills. How long did such a system continue?
