Accessions

Those of you with Internet access will probably be aware that the catalogue of the British Library Newspaper Library at Colindale has gone onto the Web (URL: www.bl.uk/collections/newspaper). There seems to be an upsurge in enthusiasm for indexing local newspapers because there are several in this listing. Examples are Matt Sears' *Victorian Londoners* and the *Meadley index to the Hull Times 1857-1927*. Also in book form are Cliff Webb's *London's bawdy courts, vol. 1: 1703-13* (an SoG publication available from our bookshop) and more indexes to London and north east Surrey church registers donated by the London Metropolitan Archives. Several family history societies like Lincolnshire and Wiltshire are forging ahead with indexing burials for their county as part of the National burial index. The CD-ROM of the National burial index arrived at the Society on 2 May - too late to go into this quarter's listing. One CD which is in the following list is the second edition of *Bertram Merrell's marriage index of Cheshire*. Other noteworthy items are on microform: film copies of the parish registers of the various churches in Coventry and the 1881 census transcription and index for Scotland (also available on CD-ROM) and Welsh muster lists 1781-82 by Stuart Tamblin on microfiche.

Library loans

You may have noticed that we no longer indicate which items are available for loan after the appearance of the next magazine. At some point the catalogue is going to go onto the Web and marking an item as for loan would lead to non-members trying to borrow material. It was therefore decided to change the category to 'Reference only' for everything and ask members to contact us if they wanted to borrow an item. Remember that we do not loan anything which is unique (eg. manuscript or type-script shown in the list as 'Ms.' and 'Ts.'). CD-ROMs, books published 100 or more years ago, limited editions, periodicals, indexes containing thousands of names or anything which is in a fragile condition. Items which are usually available for loan are individual parish registers on fiche or film,

printed books published within the last hundred years by large, mainstream publishers and some other categories of material. If the item you are interested in is not on the 'forbidden' list above then contact the library as soon as the magazine for the following quarter has appeared and we will let you know if it is borrowable. Loans can only be made to members living in the British Isles.

6. SPECIAL COLLECTIONS

Galloway, (2 boxes). Harry Galloway ran Harry Galloway Publishing, a local history publisher based in Somerset. He was a keen genealogist and was undertaking a one-name study on the Galloway surname. The Galloway Collection consists of this research, most notably a card index containing references to Galloways nationwide in the UK, but with special emphasis on the northern English counties of Durham, Yorkshire and Lancashire.

Gwyer, (1 volume). This consists of several original apprenticeship indentures, Burgess certificates and other items relating to Bristol, dating from the 17th to the 19th century and concerning the names Edwards, Gwyer, Keate, Liscom, Trott and Wickham. The items were collected and bound by Ronald George Butler Gwyer in 1964. Originally found in the Library's Family History Collection at FH/GWY, it has been transferred to the Special Collections.

Haydon Royal Pedigrees, (4 boxes). This collection consists of the research of Squadron Leader Douglas Haydon. Deposited with the Society via The Queen's Archives, Windson Castle in 2001, it consists of several volumes of pedigrees and photographs of most of Europe's royal

families, with a particular emphasis on those in Britain and Germany. The research covers the 16th to the 20th centuries. Although none of his work is dated, Squadron Leader Haydon appears to have carried out most of his research in the 1950's and 1960's. The collection is kept in the Winter Palace.

Hoddinott, (5 boxes). This collection is the work of Sheila and Paul Quance Hoddinott. It consists of research into the surname Hoddinott, mainly in Somerset and Gloucestershire, although there is some material for Middlesex, Australia, New Zealand and the USA. The bulk of the collection consists of folders with entries for individual Hoddinotts, with spaces for occupation, parents, spouse, children, place of birth and known addresses. Very few are fully completed. There is also a large quantity of Hoddinott birth certificates. Those using the collection to search for a particular individual are advised to consult the handlist (item 1) first, before searching through the rest of the collection. The handlist is also available in the Library's Family History Collection at FH/HOD.

Keats/Bracegirdle, (1 box). This collection consists of two card indexes: one for Keats and one for Bracegirdle. The indexes contain a wealth of references to the occurrence of each name in parish registers, wills deeds, alumni lists and other sources. They date from around the 17th to the 19th centuries. The indexes were compiled by Mrs J. Haynes of Harpenden, Hertfordshire. She gave them to the Society in October, 1999. They are in alphabetical order by first name.

Nuttall, (3 boxes). This collection consists of four folders of research on the Nuttall surname, as carried out by Thomas Hayhurst and W. L. F. Nuttall. The Hayhurst material was bought from its author by Nuttall in 1916. He loaned it to the Society, along with his own material in 1965. The loan numbers are 1436, 1437 and 1439. Hayhurst's work consists of one folder of typewritten notes entitled: 'The Nuttall Family of Bury Parish form the Earliest Times'. He wrote this material in 1916. Nuttall's notes concentrate on Nuttalls in Cheshire, Derbyshire, Lancashire, London, Middlesex, Norfolk, Nottinghamshire, Suffolk, Surrey, Yorkshire, Worcestershire and Ireland. There is also a section entitled 'scattered about'! The research covers the 16th to the 19th centuries, and was compiled by Nuttall from about 1916 onwards until its deposit in the 1960's. They mainly consist of extracts from the following sources: 'Heraldic Miscellany Volume 17' (in the Heralds' College, London), 'Lancashire and Cheshire Wills and Inventories at Chester' and the pedigree of Nuttall at Cattenhall, Cheshire, kept in the Heralds' College. The notes are foliated, although several pages are missing.

Ponting, (3 boxes). Ralph Ponting of Sutton Coldfield, Birmingham, came from a family that was firmly rooted in Wiltshire. His research notes concentrate on his family, the Pontings, who came from the county, and the two most closely related names, Skeate and Butler. Each name has a series of pedigrees, some research notes and lists of relevant births, marriages and deaths, certificate and will copies and miscellaneous other information. It is safe to presume that if a source for the information is not mentioned, then it has come from the 1988 International Genealogical Index. Ralph Ponting also compiled card indexes for Butler, Ponting, Skeate, Tugwell and related names from the Wiltshire area. There are spaces on each card for dates of birth, marriage and death. Some also contain brief biographical details and all give the source of the information. The collection was deposited by the Wiltshire Archaeological Society.

Steer, (3 boxes). This collection is the work of Barbara Steer, a member of the Society from the 1950's until the 1970's. The bulk of the collection comes from this period and consists of research into her own family, Steer of Northamptonshire and Yorkshire, and related names of Bacon of Northamptonshire and Greaves of Yorkshire. Other material concerns research carried out for others: Bacon, Bellchamber, Boulton, Gilliard, Lewin, Salliss and Weller. There are also two folders of research into the history of Romanoff House and Rosehill Schools, Tunbridge Wells, Kent, with a partial reconstruction of the school registers using sources such as the census.

Whitfield A, (3 boxes). John Arthur Whitfield (born 1930) was a member of the Society from 1992 until his death in 1995. He started to research his own family history in 1988, but following his retirement, this was soon extended to become a one-name study into the Whitfield surname. The project was never completed and the collection consists of the work he had carried out up to his death. John Whitfield had begun his study by extracting all Whitfield and variant entries from the International Genealogical Index (1988 version). He also collected births from the GRO indexes up to 1940, but the marriage and death entries were only completed for the years 1837-1838. The collection consists of hard and disk copy versions of the IGI and GRO index extracts, together with research notes and correspondence for Whitfield and associated names. John Whitfield concentrated on the Whitfields of Stamford-in-the-Vale, Berkshire, and there is a particularly large amount of material relating to them. The Whitfield IGI and GRO indexes are also available online at: www.guye.freeserve.co.uk. The collection was donated by Mrs Sophie Pigott in 1995.
