Accessions

Notable accessions in book form in this quarter's listing include facsimile reprints of the *National Roll of the Great War* volumes 9 and 10 for Bradford and Portsmouth (our set is now complete for all those published), *Life below stairs in the 20th century*, by the very readable Pamela Horn, two new editions of Jeremy Gibson's invaluable guides - to bishop's transcripts, marriage licences etc and to militia lists and musters, the first two volumes in a new British Record Society Hearth Tax series (for Cambridgeshire and Kent), many Devon marriage and burial transcripts, the long awaited second volume of the index to the Hertfordshire 1851 census covering the St. Albans registration district and the even longer awaited (nine years!) seventh volume of the *British settlers in Natal 1824-57*, taking the names listed down to the end of the letter G. There are also the first five volumes of *Ancestors*, the new family history magazine produced by the Public Record Office.

On microform you will find the PRO class list to the 1871 census, the index to Bank of England will extracts 1717-1807 (already available on the English Origins web site), the registers of Bradford Cathedral and Doncaster St. George and the India, or Percy Smith, index which has been filmed for us by the Genealogical Society of Utah. And finally, on CD-ROM there are the returns for the 1891 census of London (only indexed by street etc and not by names) and the heads of households in the city of Dublin in 1851.

Library budget 2002

You will see from our Notes and News that we have sadly lost staff from the Library. The redundancies came after Christmas leave arrangements had already been made. Without the help of our regular counter volunteers and especially Frank Hardy we would have found it almost impossible to run the service. Please be patient if you experience greater delays in response to your enquiries. We are all having to spend more time on the counters and less sitting at our desks responding to letters and e-mails.

The Library accessions budget for this year is greatly reduced. Some of which is already spoken for in the form of subscriptions to series such as parish register and record society publications. Many family history

societies donate copies of their register transcripts, census indexes etc to this Library, for which we are extremely grateful, especially in the present circumstances. If your local society has required payment for publications from us in previous years and you are on their committee, please could you ask if they would reconsider donating them instead, if only for this year?

Sponsorship scheme

As a result of the above, I will need to look very carefully at even the sponsored purchase of registers for the Library. If the cost of a register is small, please could potential sponsors consider providing the whole of the cost. With more expensive registers such as those from Gloucestershire and Devon, the Library may not be able to contribute 50% as it did previously.

5. SPECIAL COLLECTIONS

Turner (A) Collection - correction to entry in December 2001 listing.

The donor of this collection, J Turner worked as a professional genealogist from 1988-2001, a total of thirteen years not three as stated. The material relating to Salmon and Carrington has been removed at the demand of the original client.

Bowen, (small collections no. 33, one volume & two folders). This collection was deposited by Mrs Eileen Voce in November, 2001. The volume which is entitled: "Our Bowen Family History", was compiled by Edna Harris and the folders consist of loose notes. Mrs Harris began to compile the Bowen family pedigree in 1980 and aimed to produce a ten volume family history covering the Bowen family from 1000 to 2000. Most of this collection consists of the combined volumes 9 and 10, which cover the years 1801 - 2000. The Bowsens covered in this research come from Buckinghamshire, Herefordshire, Shropshire, Staffordshire, Warwickshire and Canada (Ottawa). There is also a folder of loose notes covering other,

non-related Bowens in Hereford, Shropshire, Wales and the United States.

Buck, (1 box). Mrs Jo-Ann Buck, a professional genealogist, deposited this collection. It consists of research carried out by Mrs Buck on behalf of five clients in the early 1970's. Mrs Buck specialised in research in Essex and the collection reflects this, with most of the families concerned having Essex roots. This collection is made available for family history research only and on the understanding that researchers will not attempt to contact any individual whose address is given. The names covered are: Neville, Paskell, Spencer and Wadsworth.

Denzey, (small collections no. 32, two folders). This is the work of the late Frank John Denzey, a member of the Society from 1970 until his death in 1996. The collection was given to the Society by his widow, Mrs Mair Denzey in 1996. The collection consists of rough notes, certificates and copy wills for the name Denzey in Pembrokeshire and Berkshire. It is accompanied by a roll pedigree donated by Mr Denzey in 1985.

Henderson/Bethmann-Hollweg, (small collections no. 31, 2 folders). This collection was donated by Caroline Powell in 2001. The notes consist of research into the Henderson family of Woolwich and elsewhere in London and the Bethmann-Hollweg family of Frankfurt in Germany. The material consists of notes and several handwritten pedigrees dating from the 18th and 19th centuries. The research itself was probably carried out in the early 20th century. The author of the material is unknown as the notes were bought at a jumble sale.

Owston, (small collections no. 34). This collection consists of copy wills, marriage allegations and certificates obtained by Roger Ouston. They mainly date from the 18th to 20th centuries and concentrate on the Oustons/Owstons found in Yorkshire.

Wedlake, (small collections no. 30, 3 comb bound typescript volumes). Jeanne Baker donated this material in October, 2001. It consists of three typescript volumes of research into the Wedlakes of Somerset, Essex and London, and their descendants and collaterals: Arter (Hampshire, Somerset & Essex); Cliffe (Essex); De Porquet (France, London & Essex); Dendy (London, Sussex, Essex & Somerset); Elton (Somerset, Essex & London); Pole (London & Berkshire); Shepherd (Kent, Essex & London) & Thompson (Essex). All the names are linked to the descendants of Thomas and Elizabeth Wedlake (nee Hancock), who married in 1774 in St. Decumans, Somerset. There are also a number of birth, marriage and death certificates, photographs, copy wills and other documents contained in the volumes.
