Accessions

It seems that more and more these days the items which I need to single out for special mention in this column are those published on CD-ROM. The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints (the Mormons) have been publishing the IGI in this form since 1994 and now a few family history societies have begun to follow suit. CD-ROM publications in this listing include, from the Latter-Day Saints, Pedigree resource file discs 11-25 (including master index), the vital records index for Mexico and the transcription and index of the 1880 US census; Bedfordshire FHS has issued a CD master name index to the transcribed Bedfordshire registers up to 1812 and Gloucestershire FHS a CD 1851 census index for their county. For one namers looking at current surname distribution or those trying to contact living relatives or friends there is the 2001 edition of the UK info disk which is based on telephone directories and voter's lists. Finally, don't get excited by the entries for various counties of Boyd's marriage index on CD-ROM - this is simply a scanned version created by English Origins in order to key in the entries. There are usually one or two pages missing where the operative has turned over two pages at once by mistake and we cannot replicate the CDs for sale. In any event, there are always a large number of queries arising from "typos" etc in the original volumes and these are all sorted out in the version on English Origins. At the time of writing this the counties indexed onto the web site are those for East Anglia (Cambridgeshire, Essex, Norfolk and Suffolk), Cumberland, Somerset and Yorkshire. By the time you read this Devon, Durham, Lancashire and Northumberland should also be available.

For those computer-phobes amongst you, there are also a number of noteworthy items in book form or on microfiche: a master index has been created by Naval and Military press to all the names appearing in the fourteen volumes of the National roll of the Great War 1914-18, Gloucestershire FHS has produced an index to monumental inscriptions in the county. This is an on-going project but the current version contains approximately 65,000 names. Fifteen volumes of the Exchequer rolls of Scotland (1264-1529) have been donated by Kensington and Chelsea Central Library and the

final batch of indexes to Greater London parish registers donated by the LMA have been bound and put on the open shelves (These include parishes south of the Thames in what was then Surrey). The latest supplement to Philby's Passenger and immigration lists index for 2003 (!) takes the number of names included in this series up to over 4 million. Finally we have published the Faculty Office marriage allegations indexes for the years 1701-1850 on microfiche and these appear in this listing.

Sponsorship scheme

5. SPECIAL COLLECTIONS

British emigrants to Argentina, (small collections no. 29, one folder). Compiled by Mr J. V. G. Williams of Rugby in the late 1970's, this collection consists of various letters, pedigrees and lists relating to British expatriates in Argentina. The material covers the 18th to 20th centuries.

Coats of arms, (small collections no. 28, one volume). Deposited by the British Records Association in c1954 (BRA 833). This volume contains many different colour illustrations of various coats of arms, the most prominent being Annesley of Bletchingdon, Oxfordshire and Salvey of Shropshire. The date of the volume is unknown, but it was probably compiled around the 1920s and 1930s. The condition is fragile and the paper is acidic and very brittle.

Elkington, (3 boxes). This collection is composed of various GRO birth, marriage and death certificates covering the period 1837 - c1960 and they relate directly to the following volumes in the Library: "Elkington Records" by Arthur E. H. Elkington, (Family History Collection, FH/ELK). The certificates are split into five categories which directly correspond to the research in the above volumes. They are as follows: box 1: Leicestershire branches (17 bundles) and Lincolnshire branches (14 bundles); box 2: Oxfordshire branches (27 bundles); box 3: Warwickshire branches (20 bundles) and unconnected individuals (7 bundles). The accession numbers are not known.

Read, (small collections no. 27, 3 folders). A Miss Read deposited this collection in 1941. It was meant to accompany the work "A Register of Reads and some Connections" by Gerald Lozano Read, which can be found in the Family History Collection at FH/REA. The collection consists of a notebook with notes from various sources, including parish registers and family bibles, together with a number of loose wills and other documents. The research concentrates particularly on Reads from London, Shropshire and Worcestershire, although other areas and names (Askwell, Curtis, Dyer, Griffin, Hawtayne,

Leverton, Ridout, Stonestreet and Strickland) are also covered.
