Help needed from a (retired?) librarian

All libraries have cataloguing backlogs and ours is no exception. Certain material is "fast forwarded" through the cataloguing process: parish registers, monumental inscriptions, census indexes, CD-ROMs, review copies and family histories. These are items for which there is the greatest demand. The remainder of incoming material is shelved in chronological order and the oldest is catalogued first. The current backlog is approximately two and a half years. For anyone drawing a shocked breath at this point, I should say that it was three years before the retrospective cataloguing project and increased to over three years during the life of the project. We have clawed back almost twelve months since then, but progress beyond this is unlikely given that our cataloguer only works three days per week with help from a volunteer, Beryl Schumer, on another day. Is there a professional librarian out there who knows the Library well and who could volunteer some cataloguing work for one day or a half day per week? We use the Q cataloguing software (MARC format) from EOS international. Training would be given but mostly the person would be working on their own since the system seems to get indigestion if more than one person is cataloguing at once! This means fitting in around the hours worked by our cataloguer and her volunteer - possibly on a Saturday?

Map Chest Appeal

The Society has a large collection of maps, many of which are currently inaccessible due to inadequate storage facilities. We were about to order a map chest when the library's budget was cut and the plan had to be put on hold. The situation is now becoming rather urgent, so it has been decided to appeal to the membership for donations.

The map chest that we have in mind costs £350.00. If any members would like to contribute something towards the purchase, this would be a great help. Alternatively, if anyone has an old map/plan chest that they do not want, or knows where we can get one at a reasonable price, we should be very pleased to hear from you. It would need to be at least an A1 size chest (i.e. around 1000mm wide, 700mm deep and no more than 820mm high).

In addition to a map chest, we also need some archival storage/display folders and pockets in which to keep the individual maps safely. The cost of these varies, depending on the type, size and quantity ordered, but it can be anything from £20.00 - £120.00 per pack.

Your donation, however small, would help us to get some way towards our goal of a properly maintained map collection, from which all library users would benefit. Thank you very much for your support.
