There are quite a number of Society publications in this quarter's accessions - both new titles and new editions. The second edition of *My Ancestor was a Merchant Seaman* is a welcome return to print of, arguably, the best book on the subject. Quite a few new county source guides to library holdings are listed below. Those for Essex, Kent, Lincolnshire and Sussex give details of registers (C of E and non-conformist) and marriage licence material held in the library, while the ones for Cheshire, Lancashire and the Isle of Man, Cornwall and Devon, Dorset and Somerset and Yorkshire include notes of transcripts of monumental (tombstone) inscriptions held as well as registers. The National Index of Parish Registers series is represented by volumes for Dorset, Hampshire and the Isle of Wight, Norfolk and Shropshire. Finally, there are further London apprenticeship registers indexed by Cliff Webb - for Cutlers, Brewers and Feltmakers.

Thanks to the generous donations of various members mentioned in last quarter's magazine, we have been able to fill in some of our gaps in the Victoria County History series and have purchased volumes for Essex, Gloucestershire, Lancashire, Middlesex, Oxfordshire, Shropshire, Staffordshire, Wiltshire and Yorkshire. More will follow as soon as I find reasonably priced sources of supply!

Many British Record Society publications index fairly early sources but volume 118 listed below indexes probate records for Sudbury Archdeaconry

(which covered half of Suffolk) for the period 1801 to 1858.

Another welcome re-appearance, after a gap of fifteen years (!), is the second edition of the Gibson guide to local newspapers in England, Wales, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man 1750-1920. This is a hugely condensed listing of the type of information given in great detail in the multi-volume set of NEWSPLAN reports which we have in the library (on the Textbook shelves). These reports were compiled as a response to the worry over the growing deterioration of files of original newspapers held at Colindale and at repositories all over the country. The reports list local newspapers giving details of all regional and national holdings and making recommendations on priorities for conservation filming. If your interest is in Irish or Scottish newspapers, there are NEWSPLAN reports on these areas which are beyond the remit of the Gibson guide.

The last items which I should mention in book form are the *Genealogical Research Directory* and the *Register of one name studies* for 2002, *Passenger and immigration lists index* 2003, part 2, and the index produced by Frank Hardy with help from David Horwill to the first five volumes of the Great Western Railway probate (or stock transfer) registers. Frank would welcome more volunteers for this project but they would need to do the indexing at the Society as the original volumes must stay on the premises.

Material on microfiche includes a number of burial indexes 1813-1900 for Lincolnshire parishes and many 1891 census indexes for the North Riding of Yorkshire.

Just over £376 was made from the sale of duplicate library books at the Society's Family History Experience at Stoneleigh in September. I have to admit that no sooner did the first takings come in than I hot-footed it over to the Latter-Day Saints stand to purchase one or two items on CD-ROM - notably the second edition of the British Vital Records Index containing 12.3 million births, baptisms and marriages 1538-1888 and the

Canadian 1881 census transcription and index. Also on CD there are a number of baptism register transcripts for Cornish parishes, the 1891 census for Lancashire (indexed by street only), the transcription and indexes for Nottinghamshire for 1841 and for Nottingham for 1851 and the Wiltshire 1851 census transcription and index.
