Accessions

Items in book form in this issue include three Society publications: a second edition of *My ancestors were in the Salvation Army*, a fourth edition of *My ancestors were Londoners* and a new county source guide for the City of London and Middlesex which lists the Library holdings of registers, marriage licences and monumental inscriptions. Remember that, as members, you can get a 20% discount on the cost of these publications by quoting your membership number at the time of your order. Other notable items in book form include indexes to the men serving in various regiments in about 1806 taken from the WO 25 records at the Public Record Office; an index to the names in the Archbishop of York's marriage bonds and allegations 1690-1715; several Victoria County Histories purchased thanks to the generosity of a number of members who gave money for this purpose; the Harleian Society publication of the Visitation of Herefordshire 1634 and a poll book for the city of Liverpool 1796.

On microform there are half a dozen fiche "reprints" of pedigrees from the Herald's visitations by Foster and others which were originally published in the late nineteenth century and are therefore rare on the second-hand book market; the registers and parish chest material for Chiswick, the originals of which are still at the church, and a few census returns - most notably many returns for Wiltshire in 1871 and a very large number of census indexes on fiche. The cataloguing of census material is always tricky and it used to be exclusively done by our Genealogy Officer, Else Churchill. However, given pressure of other work and the change to new cataloguing software which is much more complicated to use

than the previous version, Else, decided it was time to call it a day. Unfortunately she was forced to hand over quite a backlog and we have only just caught up with the census indexes on fiche (There is a smaller backlog of indexes in book form which will be catalogued for the next magazine). The returns for Orphir in Orkney which have been transcribed by David Armstrong even list the livestock and boats or ploughs (of improved design!) owned by the households!

Borrowing material from the Library

A lot of members seem to be unaware that one of the privileges of membership is the right to borrow certain categories of material from the Library for use at home. This can be done either on a visit to the Library or by post or e-mail request. Up to four items may be borrowed at one time (an item is a book or a film or up to twenty fiche from a set). Registers are loaned for one week and other material for two, with the right to renew twice by phone provided another member has not requested it.

Not all material is borrowable. Basically we cannot loan anything which is unique or was produced in such small quantity that it would be virtually impossible to replace. This includes therefore manuscript and typescript items, privately printed works and other limited editions. Anything published over one hundred years ago or which is in a fragile condition is also not for loan. We will also not loan

anything which contains thousands of names such as census, will or marriage indexes, directories, poll books and standard reference works since there is a strong possibility that they are being consulted frequently in the Library by other members, who will be understandably cross if the item they want happens to be out on loan on the day of their visit.

So what can be borrowed? Generally most church registers and monumental inscriptions on fiche or film and books published within the last hundred years by mainstream publishers - which would include most textbooks (as opposed to reference works). Anything which comes within these categories in the current listing can be borrowed after the publication of the next magazine. For older material, if you are in the Library, bring the item to the enquiry counter to find out if it can be borrowed (Even if it says "Not available for loan" it is still worth enquiring). If you have found something listed in one of our county source guides or on our web-site then drop us a line or e-mail library@sog.org.uk and we will let you know if a loan is possible. You will be asked to pay for the costs each way by insured postage.

If you don't have a film or fiche reader yourself you may find that your local public library dealing with the history of your area may allow you to use theirs by appointment on their quiet day, but this will certainly be at the discretion of the Librarian so do be nice to him or her!

Map Chest Appeal Update

As reported in the last issue of the *Library Update*, the marvellous response to our appeal means that we are in a position to buy a much better map chest than the "budget" model we had in mind, as well as much-needed archival map folders and other conservation materials for the map collection generally.

Originally, we had planned to get a standard A1 size map chest but, after further consideration, it has been decided to buy a larger A0 chest because of the greater flexibility it would provide. The drawers can be divided to take maps of various sizes so it would, effectively, be two map chests in one, being able to accommodate both A1 and A0 sized maps; anything, in fact, from A5 to A0. The only problem is finding the space to put it! We have earmarked an area in Store A (in the Lower Library) for it, but we will have to reorganise the existing shelving in order to fit it in. This means that it will be a few weeks before the chest is actually purchased and installed and, due to the backlog in cataloguing and the rearrangement of the entire map collection, it will probably be several months before the collection is fully accessible.

Our thanks go, once again, to those members whose generous donations have made this possible. We should also like to thank Mr Ellson and Mr Funnell, both of whom offered us free map chests. Unfortunately, we have had to decline their offers because the chests were wooden and we have since been advised to buy a steel chest for reasons of security and fire prevention.

We will keep you up to date with developments in future issues of the *Library Update*.
