Accessions

This accessions list includes the next batch of 1891 census return films. Those counties which have now been catalogued are: Bedfordshire, Berkshire (2 piece numbers missing), Buckinghamshire, Cambridgeshire, Cornwall, Devon, Dorset, Essex, Gloucestershire, Hampshire, Herefordshire, Hertfordshire, Huntingdonshire, Kent, London/Middlesex (4 piece numbers missing), Norfolk, Northamptonshire, Oxfordshire, Shropshire, Somerset, Suffolk, Surrey, Sussex and Wiltshire. There are also several items on microfiche worthy of special mention. These include the Anstruther Catholic marriage index, which covers mainly London, Middlesex and Essex but with a few registers from Kent, Surrey and Norfolk and several personal registers of peripatetic priests. There are also four more "volumes" (on fiche!) of the Bristol baptisms index 1813-37, a large number of Lancashire register and MI (tombstone inscription) transcripts, a further tranche of the Lincolnshire burial index 1813-1900 and the first part of a large order from the Parish Register Transcription Society (for Sussex in this case).

In book form, we have an index to the Archbishop of York's marriage bonds and allegations 1660-1689, the Victoria County history covering the history and topography of the city of Chester, a new edition of the *Local historian's encyclopedia* and a second edition of John Titford's book on writing and publishing your family history. Of our own publications there are two more volumes in Cliff Webb's indexes of London apprentices - for the Pewterers' and Tallow Chandlers' Companies -

and a new county source guide for Wales, including holdings of registers, marriage licences and monumental inscriptions. These three can be purchased at the Society or from our web site.
