Accessions

This quarter's accessions list includes a facsimile reprint of the Army List for November 1918, which is important in that it includes Australian, Canadian and New Zealand officers as well as British. There are National Archives class lists, chiefly for PCC and Registrar General classes, the *Genealogical Research Directory* for 2004, *Palaeography for family and local historians*, by Hilary Marshall, who lectures for us on this subject and our most recent publication in the Ancestor series: *My ancestor was a bastard*, by Ruth Paley. This last exercised our webmaster greatly since he wanted to put notification of it on the Society's home page, but was afraid that the word "bastard" might get our site blocked by peoples' internet security software! Finally, the last volumes of the 1851 census indexes by the Cumbria FHS appear in this list. They have now completed indexing Cumberland, Westmorland and 'their' part of Lancashire for 1851.

On microform there are the first tranche of the film copies of the Chelsea pensioners soldiers documents 1760-1854. These are not complete but the whole series has been indexed by the Friends of the National Archives onto PROCAT, which can be seen in the search rooms at Kew and at the FRC in London.

Finally, on CD-ROM, there is a most generous donation by the Family History Society of Cheshire which includes CD-ROMs of Earwaker and Ormerod's histories of Cheshire, the latest version of the Cheshire marriage index, incorporating Bertram Merrell's, Hartley Jones and the mid-Cheshire marriage indexes, and complete surname indexes and census images for the 1851 and 1871 censuses of Cheshire.

Two significant omissions from the library's French Nobility reference material have just been published on CD as advertised in the October 2004 *Genealogie Magazine*. The titles are *Dictionnaire de La Nobless* by D'Aubert de La Chesnaye-Debois (3rd edition, originally in 19 volumes) now on CD for 148 Euros and *Histoire genealogique et chronologique de la Maison royale de France ...* (originally in 9 volumes) now on CD at 183 Euros. Both titles are indexed in Price's *Guide to European Genealogies* (The European equivalent of Whitmore and Marshall). The CDs are published by Heraldique & Genealogie. Thanks to the generosity of our Fellows and one or two 'ordinary' members, especially Anne Loveridge, almost all of the amount needed for this important resource has been raised. If you had intended to contribute but had not yet got around to it, please consider doing so when you read this. The books were purchased at the pre-publication price via our Bookshop so they did not cost quite as much as they would otherwise have done. They have now been catalogued, as you will see from the accessions list, and can be found on the Biography

shelves in the Upper Library. The price included one year's access to the online version as well, so this can be used from our Internet suite. The online version has the original 1901 edition as well as the new one. It is quite interesting to see the differences between them in articles like the ones on Oscar Wilde. Clearly subjects such as his homosexuality could not be mentioned in the post Victorian era.

Library catalogue

We have now converted five of the eight catalogue terminals in the library to the new WebOPAC version. As a result of very helpful input from our beta-testers, it is changing week by week and hopefully becoming more user friendly in the process. The roll-out to members for use from their home PCs should happen in the first half of this year but our IT support volunteers need to work out how to get the membership database into the catalogue's 'Patron file'.
