## Accessions

This quarter's accessions is much smaller than usual due to our cataloguer developing tendonitis in her right hand and being off work for four weeks. She is back now but her work rate is greatly reduced for the time being. Despite this, we have one or two interesting items in the enclosed accessions list. At a recent visit to The National Archives at Kew I discovered a sale of HMSO publications at greatly reduced prices: these are details calendars of Tudor and Stuart assize court cases in the home counties. also in book form is the biographical register of graduates of St. Andrew's University 1747-1897 which adds detail to the bare list of names given in the matriculation roll covering the same period.

On film we have the second installment of the WO 97 soldiers discharged to pension 1760-1854 which has been indexed onto The National Archives on-line catalogue. There are also a number of film copies of the registers of some important town and city registers: those for churches in Shrewsbury and Warwick.

Finally on CD-ROM there is the second edition of Soldiers died in the Great War, some seaman's crew lists for 1851 and some transcripts of Nottinghamshire burials 1533-circa 1906.
