London bomb blasts

As I write this we have just come back into the building from standing for two minutes silent vigil in memory of the people killed and maimed on 7th July. As we were only two train stops away from Kings Cross, we have had worried messages from friends as far away as Australia and New Zealand, checking that no one from the Society had been injured or worse. Thanks go to all those who were concerned about us. We decided to evacuate the building fairly soon after learning that it was bombs and not a couple of power surges as was thought at first. However, we had to wait until we were sure that everyone had transport to get home by. By lunch time some trains had started running again, though not the buses, and we closed just after 2pm. We did not know how badly transport would be affected on the Friday and Saturday, especially for our two staff who commute from the Kent and Sussex coasts. The police were urging people not to make non-essential journeys into the City, so the decision was made to remain closed until 10am on Tuesday. The telephone answering machine was left with the "We are sorry the Society is now closed" message and our web site had more specific information on the home page. If anyone missed both of these and turned up on Friday or Saturday, we apologise for the inconvenience caused.

Accessions

Books catalogued in the last three months include *The Genealogical Research Directory* (25th year of publication!) and *The Family and Local History Handbook* for 2005 and the

first two "volumes" of Hertfordshire Record Society's new occasional series of county maps.

On film we have the final installment of the WO 97 soldiers discharged to pension 1760-1854 which has been indexed onto The National Archives on-line catalogue and a fragment at the beginning of the WO 364 World War I soldiers documents - the so-called "unburnt" series - names A to Burch. There are also film copies of Segar and Edmondson's 18th century *Baronagium genealogicum* (indexed in Marshall's *Genealogist's guide*) and Polwhele's *History of Devonshire* and on fiche a large number of burial indexes kindly donated by Cardiganshire Family History Society.

On CD-ROM there are burials 1854-2003 at Luton General Cemetery and volume three of the St. David's Diocese wills series, covering 1672-90.

Finally, you will notice that we have expanded the information given in the listing of Document Collection accessions. We hope that this will make it easier for you to decide if items are likely to be of interest to you.

Library catalogue

We "soft launched" the catalogue on the Internet in late July. By the time you read this there should be a link on the home page of our web site. If not, type in the URL: www.sog.org.uk/sogcat

To find what we have for a place or surname:-

Browse search

1. Go to the "Look for:" box and change the default "Titles" to "Subject" by clicking on the downward pointing triangle at the right and then clicking on "Subject" in the drop-down list.
2. Click in the "Begins with:" box and type the place name or surname. (Don't worry about upper or lower case as it doesn't matter which you use). If the place name begins North..., Nether..., Long... or similar, type in the second element of the name first. eg. Cadbury for North or South Cadbury.
3. Click on the green "Go" button
4. Choose the place name or surname from the list on the page by clicking on the word itself. (If the word you want is on the next page, click on the right pointing red triangle). The maximum number of titles per page is 25, so if your search term has more "hits" than this, you will need to click on the page number "2" which is both at the top right and bottom right of the current list of titles.

Power search

If you are researching in a city or get a very large number of hits using the above technique, you can reduce them to a more manageable number by using Power search:

1. Click on Power search on the red margin at the left of the screen.
2. Type in (for example) "Liverpool" in one box and "registers" or "monumental inscriptions" (ie. Tombstone inscriptions) in another.
3. Click on the green "Go" button

You could also find wills, censuses, directories, poll books and marriage licences for a particular county in the same way: eg. "Devon" in one box and "wills" in the second. Note that all these terms are plural. For censuses you could add the year eg. "1851" in the third box and for directories the decade for which you are searching eg. "189?" - Where the question mark replaces digits 0-9 so that you retrieve all directories for the 1890s.

On the red bar at the left there are also links to a very helpful tutorial and a set of quick reference "Frequently Asked Questions". Do take a few minutes to have a look at these as they have been compiled with help from the volunteers who beta tested the site for us. Good hunting!
