Accessions

The accessions list this quarter is smaller than usual due to the need to re-index our catalogue database. So large is it that the job took four weeks to complete, during which time no cataloguing could be done.

All of the notable items in this list are, unusually these days, in book form. You may have read in the last magazine, the obituary of my predecessor at the Society, Lawson Edwards. He left his book collection to the Society and a few of the hundreds of volumes appear below (some of the Oxford history of England series etc.). More will appear in due course as we catalogue them. In the same month, we also received a donation of five boxes of books withdrawn from the House of Lords library.

Two of the items which I have singled out for your notice are the Royal Navy lieutenants' passing certificates 1691-1902 which form volumes 289-290 of the List and Index Society. From about 1789 these certificates are usually accompanied by notices of baptism. Berkshire Family History Society is to be congratulated on the completion of its mammoth twelve year project to make abstracts from all the Overseers of the Poor documents at Berkshire Record Office. In 2004 they completed the project by the issue of a composite index to all 26 volumes of the abstracts. Other items include the Victoria County History volume covering the city of Chester, the Harleian Society publication of the visitation of London 1678, an almost complete set of indexes to the 1841 census of Caithness and the latest Passenger and immigration lists index. Lastly I would like to

commend to you a London Topographical Society volume of maps which cover a later period than is usually noted here: they are the London County Council bomb damage maps 1939-45. Each one is detailed enough to show individual buildings and those which have been coloured in indicate houses etc which were destroyed or damaged by bombs - black for total destruction, purple for damaged beyond repair and so on. This has confirmed my suspicions about my own house which is shown black on the map and explains why my roof is a different colour tile from the neighbours and why I am always digging up burnt brick fragments in the garden!
