Accessions

Amongst the accessions in book form this quarter there is a set of 20 Crockford's clerical directories dating between 1891 and 1941 and a Clergy list for 1868, which fill in many gaps in our holdings. On fiche there are a large number of MIs for Essex and the McKirdy index to the statutory death registers for Peebleshire 1855-75. On CD-ROM there is the Berkshire burial index, Cambridgeshire christening and burial indexes 1813-37 and a marriage index for the same county covering varying dates; the Northamptonshire marriage index 1700-1837; Dr David Wright's West Kent probate index 1750-1858 and the second collection of the Wiltshire wills beneficiaries index.

Somerset registers

We recently had an opportunity to purchase, at a very reduced price, a large number of Somerset registers on microfiche. Since it will take me a very long time to catalogue them all, I have had skeleton entries for them entered onto the library catalogue. If there is a Somerset parish register which you have not found in the library before, do please check our on-line catalogue to see if it is included in this batch. The URL is www.sog.org.uk/sogcat/access. Change the "Look for" from titles to subject and type in the parish name in the "Begins with" box. Strictly speaking, none of them can be borrowed by members until three months after they have appeared in the accessions list in the magazine, so if anyone particularly wants to borrow one for use at home could they please sponsor the purchase? They cost us 50p per fiche and the number of fiche per parish is given in the catalogue record. If you

are interested in doing this I should warn that many of them have been filmed "sideways" and need a viewer with image rotation. Phone me on 020 7702 5484 if you need to find out if this is the case for the one you are interested in.

Photocopiers

The Board of Trustees has decided that, despite money being tight this year, two of our ancient photocopiers cannot be allowed to limp on any longer. New copiers with coin boxes have been ordered and should be in place by the time you read this. Do, however, remember that because of the law of copyright, you can only copy (and that includes using a digital camera) a maximum of 5% of any one item. There will be notices to this effect on the new machines.

Changes to library rules

Last year the Board of Trustees authorised a revision of Society rules. If you have not seen them or have lost your copy, they are

available from the Society or on our website (follow the link from Library info on the Home page). Two changes which affect library use are worth mentioning in abbreviated form here: The cut-off point for books which may be borrowed has been reduced from those published less than 100 years ago to those published less than 60 years ago. The second is that a small fee of £2.00 has been introduced for those who have permission to use a digital camera in the library. No copying using personal equipment can be done without permission and the law of copyright must be observed. Any copies made should be for private research and permission would be needed if they were going to be published in any way eg. in a book or on the web. Permission would normally be freely given provided that the Society was quoted as the source.

Free access to on-line subscription data from the library

Members who do not visit the library frequently may like to know that in addition to free access to British Origins (SoG datasets, 1841 and 1871 censuses etc.) and Ancestry (1851-1901 censuses, Pallot's marriage index etc.), we now have free access to 1837online (GRO indexes, 1861 census and more to come). This only applies to access from our Internet PCs in the Lower Library - not from your home computer. Having said that, remember that SoG members are entitled to one free access per quarter to SoG data on British Origins from home.
