## Accessions

There are a lot of good textbooks in this quarter's accessions. By Simon Fowler, our former archivist and now editor of *Ancestors* magazine, there are *Tracing your army ancestors*, *Workhouse: the people, the places, the life behind doors* and a jointly authored publication with another of our members, Kathy Chater, called *Finding out about your family history*. The latter is a very brief, inexpensive guide for beginners. Two of our own publications appearing below are *My ancestor was a lawyer* and *My ancestors were watermen* [in London]. The former is written by two very well-qualified members, Brian Brooks, who compiled the lawyers and attorneys index which we have in the library and Marc Herber, who wrote the award-winning *Ancestral trails* and is, himself, a lawyer. The overseas section also includes *Tracing ancestors in Barbados: a practical guide*.

Other items of note in the relatively small accessions list are the Cumberland Copeland burial index (mainly 1813-37), two parish register transcript CDs kindly donated by Kent Family History Society, one of which incorporates the Medway marriage index, a number of fiche copies of original parish registers for Northamptonshire and Somerset and those for Leeds St. Peter in Yorkshire (up to 1812) and two large atlases of maps of historic towns in Ireland. Finally there are the books associated with the enormous Haskell Collection which the compiler has just donated to the library.
