Accessions

Notable acquisitions on microfilm: A generous donation from our former Bookshop Manager and well known lecturer on military sources, Ken Divall, has enabled us to fill in many gaps in our holdings of the WO 97 soldiers discharged to pension records. A few of the original batch of films of this series donated by the PRO did not get reported in the magazine as some reels were out on loan to the relevant regimental museums for in-depth indexing. The listing in this magazine completes the record of our current holdings; Film copies of Leeds St. Peter christenings 1813-37 have been added to the initial purchase and more are on order; Scottish census returns, mostly for 1851, for Dumfriesshire, Ross and Cromarty, Roxburghshire and the Shetlands which were luckily ordered just before New Register House announced that it would not be selling them any more.

Books and maps include: Anthony Adolph's *Collins guide to tracing your family history*, Stuart Raymond's *Introducing family history*, the latest edition (the 7th) of *Tracing your ancestors at the National Archives* by Amanda Bevan, two guides to tracing 1st and 2nd world war ancestors by our former archivist and current editor of *Ancestors* magazine, Simon Fowler, who is an acknowledged expert on military sources and has the rare gift of communicating that knowledge and experience in readable and clear way, the *Genealogical Research Directory*, affectionately known as the GRD, and now in its 27th, and sadly last, year, the Guild of One-Name Studies 2007 register of names being researched by its members, *Rivers of the north*, published by the London Printing Company in 1894 which will be another source of entries for the Business Index and the latest batch of Alan Godfrey reprints of old Ordnance Survey maps.

CD-ROMs: Thanks to another generous donor, Dr John Shackleton, we have purchased many Derbyshire register transcripts published by Ancestral Archives. This series is especially welcome in view of the fact that we cannot yet buy copies of the original registers. Kent FHS has very kindly donated yet another of its register transcript compilations (volume 5) containing entries for 41 parishes including various Canterbury registers and finally, some transcripts of surviving pre-1841 censuses for the Calderdale area and volume 4 of the *Pedigree resource file* are also listed below.

Update on the availability of microform copies of registers

Cornwall has given us a letter of permission to purchase film copies of their registers from the LDS. Our agreement with them means that, like Suffolk, copying - even of a single page for private research - is not allowed. \$30 per reel (about £15)

Essex has raised its price to £2.15 per fiche plus postage.

Herefordshire. We now have permission to buy film copies of the registers and bishop's transcripts from the LDS for \$30 per reel (about £15).

Wiltshire. Fiche copies of parish registers can be purchased from Wiltshire and Swindon Record Office for £2.20 each plus postage and packing. Marriage registers less than 75 years old are not sold. They are in the process of moving to Chippenham and will be closed until the end of October this year but are answering e-mail and other enquiries.

Yorkshire. Sheffield Archives. Copies of existing films are charged at £29 each and fiche are £1 each.

Remember that the Sterling/US dollar exchange rate is greatly in our favour at the moment so any films bought from the Latter Day Saints are especially good value just now.

5. SPECIAL COLLECTIONS

- Bennett Small Collection**, (Box 9, Item 40, 2 folders). The papers in this collection were found in Store A. They are obviously quite old and probably came from Harrington Gardens or even before that. The compiler appears to have intended them for publication. However, the papers seem to relate to all persons of the name Bennett, however spelt, and much of the material has been extracted from well known reference books, such as visitation records, books of peerages and baronetages, biographical books, etc. There are a number of photographs of various Bennetts and houses inhabited by Bennett. There are also several pedigrees which have been deposited in the Roll Pedigree Collection in Store A.
- Billings Small Collection**, (Box 1, Item 1, 1 folder). This collection was donated by Robert Goss of London. He is one of the Billings researchers (as of October, 1981: *see* Bundle A). He joined the Society in 1983 and researched the Billings for Cornwall. *See* also the pedigree in the Roll Pedigree Collection in Store A.
- Coats of Arms Small Collection**, (Box 6, Item 28, 1 folder). This collection was deposited by the British Records Association, *circa* 1954. The single volume contains colour illustrations of various coats of arms, the most prominent being Annesley of Bletchingdon, Oxfordshire and Salvey of Shropshire. The date of the volume is unknown, but it was probably compiled in the 1920s or 1930s. Note: the paper is very acidic and brittle.
- Courtney (B) Small Collection**, (Box 24, Item 85, 1 folder). This collection consists of various papers concerning the estates of Abraham Courtney, R.N. surgeon and his wife, Emma Ann Courtney, from the Isle of Thanet, Kent. It includes the will and probate from Emma Courtney, proved 6 March, 1862; inland revenue papers from Abraham Courtney's estate in 1855 and two insurance policies belonging to Abraham Courtney and Charles Townley.
- Denzey Small Collection**, (Box 7, Item 32, 2 folders). This is the work of the late Frank John Denzey, a member of the Society from 1970 until his death in 1996. The collection was given to the Society by his widow, Mrs Mair Denzey in 1996 and consists of rough notes, certificates and photocopies of wills for the name Denzey in Pembrokeshire and Berkshire. The research covers the 16th-20th centuries but is fairly limited. It is accompanied by a roll pedigree donated by Mr Denzey in 1985.
