## Accessions

Unlike recent accessions lists, this quarter's has more of note in paper form than on CD-ROM. First, a reminder for older members of the rigorous scholarship of our former Director, Anthony Camp, demonstrated by his current book on Royal mistresses and bastards between 1714 and 1936. There is another in our "My ancestor ..." series - this one on those who worked in the theatre. The first issue has been published by the BBC of its new magazine to accompany the Who do you think you are? series. This explains why there is virtually no explanation of the methodology used by the researchers in this series - they were saving the "how to do it yourself" element for the magazine. I suppose from their point of view it makes for smoother television presentation and provides them with a stream of, obviously much needed, income if recent redundancies at the BBC are anything to go by. There is the latest tranche of old Ordnance Survey map reprints; a large number of Durham register and monumental inscription transcripts kindly donated by Northumberland and Durham Family History Society; a new book in the series by the London Topographical Society recording the changing map of London. This one, covering the early years of the 20th century, shows London before two world wars devastated large areas of the capital. There are many Somerset MIs, mostly translated and donated by Sir Mervyn Medlycott, the Llandaf probate index 1568-1699 which completes our indexes to pre-1858 Welsh wills and *Passenger and immigration lists index 2008 supplement* (sic) which takes the number of names indexed to over 4.8 million and which is not included on the Ancestry.com website.

CD-ROM accessions include Stuart Tamblin's Criminal register indexes (HO 27) 1805-16, a large number of Derbyshire register transcripts sponsored by Dr J Shackleton, an index to wills in the Worcester District Probate Registry 1858-1928 and the Pembrokeshire pre-1813 marriage index donated by

J Mein. On fiche there is an index to Lincolnshire masters and apprentices 1711-1808 (from TNA class IR 1) and transcripts of baptisms, burials and MIs donated by Lincolnshire Family History Society and further registers for Leeds St. Peter sponsored by Dr J Shackleton and M Clayton.
