Accessions

Most of the notable accessions in this quarter's list are in book form. Of our own publications in the *My ancestor was ...* series we have two new titles - *My ancestor was a Royal Marine* and *My ancestor was an agricultural labourer*. There are also three new editions in this series - the 2nd edition of the title on Thames watermen, the 4th edition of *My ancestors were Jewish* and the 5th edition of the volume on Londoners. In the State Papers section you will find a huge number of calendars and reports of various government departments through the years which were very kindly donated by the National Army Museum. My hatchback was filled to capacity and the overflow had to come here by taxi!

Other note-worthy titles are the Biographical dictionary of *British Quakers in commerce and industry 1775-1920*, the 3rd edition of John Grenham's excellent *Tracing your Irish ancestors*, the 9th edition of *Marriage indexes for family historians* by Jeremy Gibson et al., two new books on family history on the Internet by Stuart Raymond, the Allerdale (Cumberland) burial index 1813-37 donated by Nick Newington-Irving, some Herefordshire MIs donated by Herefordshire FHS and the twelfth Victoria County History volume for Middlesex covering Chelsea. We have also acquired the last edition in a very useful series of books for London. *The Names of streets and places in the administrative county of London ...* shows every road and block of flats etc. and which parish outside the City of London it was situated in. For streets within the City it merely gives "City of London" in the parish column. The first edition was published by the London County Council in 1901, the second in 1912, the third in 1929 and the current volume in this list is the fourth edition of 1955.

On CD-ROM we have bought the Herefordshire marriage index 1538-1837 and there are a number of Norfolk registers and register transcripts on CD and microfiche.

One large addition to the library which arrived only recently is 77 reels of 1851 census returns for Scotland. These were bought from money left to the Society by my predecessor, Mr Lawson Edwards. Hopefully, I will have catalogued them by the time you receive this and a search on our on-line catalogue for your parish of interest will reveal whether it is included on one of these films. Indexes to Scottish census returns are available in full on ancestry.co.uk (free access from our Internet suite) or in part on FreeCEN, a sister site of FreeBMD.
