Accessions

Now that our cataloguer has more or less recovered from breaking her wrist, we have managed to put together a larger accessions list for you. Nick Newington-Irving, who is one of the Library's most stalwart supporters, gave us a lot of books a few years ago and some are listed below - mainly on military and medical subjects and local studies material for London. Also in hard copy format we have a Carlisle Diocese marriage licence index 1775-1788, Debrett's Peerage 2008, a revised edition of our own *My ancestors were Baptists*, the 2008 edition of the register of surnames being researched by members of the Guild of One-Name Studies, many local history pamphlets for Kent donated by J R Adsett, Peter Marcan's *Greater London history and heritage handbook 2007*, *Tracing your Scottish ancestors* (in the National Archives of Scotland) by Cecil Sinclair and the *Biographical index of East India Company Maritime Service officers 1600-1834* which we somehow missed when it was published by the British Library in 1999.

Claire Bullen, our Periodicals Librarian, asks me to mention the receipt of a large donation from Derrick Porter of *The Blue*, school magazine of Christ's Hospital, Horsham. The incomplete issues covering 1903-1918 are particularly interesting because of the lists of wounded, missing and "killed in action" for staff and old boys, often including mini-biographies. There are also medal rolls, mentions in despatches and rolls of honour. The complete set from 1945-2006 cover the tail end of World War II with similar news of staff and old boys in the services. Peacetime issues report news of former pupils including obituaries.

On microfilm we have the extensive registers of Rochdale sponsored by the Halsted Trust and a large number of Scottish 1851 census returns purchased from the Lawson Edwards bequest. We

now have complete coverage of the 1851 census for the islands or counties of Shetland, Caithness, Sutherland, Ross and Cromarty, Nairn, Moray, Banff, Aberdeen, Kincardine, Berwick, Roxburgh, Dumfriess, Kirkcudbright and Wigtown, with almost complete holdings for Angus (Forfar), Fife, Renfrew and about half of Lanark including Glasgow and the Gorbals but not Barony parish. We have a few reels for Argyll, East Lothian (Haddington), Inverness, Kincardine, Midlothian, Stirling and Sutherland. If anyone would like to sponsor 1851 returns for any of these counties or for Ayr, Bute, Clackmannan, Dunbarton (Dumbarton), Kinross, Linlithgow, Orkney, Peebles, Perth or Selkirk, for which we have nothing, please contact me (see below).

Important CD-ROM acquisitions include the 6th edition of the Berkshire burial index, part 1 of Chester Diocese marriage licences 1750-1837, the Dorset surname index to baptisms, marriages and tombstone inscriptions, the Leicester project index to CMB, Lincolnshire inquests 1753-1880, death duties 1796-1821, probate indexes 1700 or 1800 to 1910, baptism and burial indexes 1754-1812 and burial indexes 1813-1900 for a number of deaneries, Nottinghamshire CMB viewers, CMB 1538-1812 for 20 Rutland parishes, Shropshire marriage index 1538-1837, Suffolk marriage index 1813-37, East Sussex 1851 census transcript and index, Worcestershire tombstone inscriptions, Yorkshire parish register transcripts by the Yorkshire Archaeological Society, Swansea St. John CMB index and volume 7 of the *Pedigree resource file* containing discs 131-135 and the master index to discs 1-135.
